Budget Message

Dear Mayor Owen and Town Council Members:

Presented for your consideration is the recommended Administration Budget for the Town of Beech Mountain for Fiscal Year 2015-2016. This budget has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act and attempts to keep the tax rate, water, sewer, and sanitation rates as low as possible, while at the same time addressing some of the Town's more pressing needs. Capital items are proposed to address needs. Revenues plus Fund Balances are projected to meet the expenditures in the General, Water/Sewer, Sanitation and E-911 Funds.

General Fund

The proposed tax rate for fiscal year 2015-2016 is \$.732 per \$100 of valuation. This rate remains unchanged from Fiscal Year 2014 -2015. This rate is based on a tax valuation of \$532,962,100 and a 97% tax collection rate. Each penny on the tax rate generates approximately \$53,296.

The total General Fund expenditures are projected to be \$6,249,215 resulting in a decrease of approximately 10.4% over last fiscal year's budget. This decrease is the result of the new Water Treatment Plant having been partially funded from the prior year's fund balance. Each department has worked diligently to reduce spending for this fiscal year and only necessary capital outlay items are being requested in the 2015-2016 budget.

General Fund revenues are projected to be more than last year due to a slight increase in the property value of the town. The budget proposes the purchase of a number of capital items as outlined in the five year capital plan.

Water and Sewer Fund

Water and sewer fund revenues are projected to remain the same as last year. Water and sewer fund expenditures are projected to be \$2,486,150 an increase of approximately .20% over last year's budget. Included in expenditures is a pump station for Ashwood and funds for the Spruce Hollow supply line.

Sanitation Fund

Sanitation revenues are expected to be slightly more than last year. Sanitation expenditures are projected to decrease as a result of no new capital items having been proposed.

E-911 Fund

The total proposed budget for 911 monies will remain the same as the prior year. Proposed capital outlay includes the creation of a backup center which is required by the E911 Board.

Salaries and Benefits

The proposed budget includes increases for most all employees as outlined in "Option six" of the 2015 Salary Study. The proposed budget also includes the continuation of a \$300 Christmas bonus for all employees and continuation of the certification program.

The Town provides major medical insurance to employees using a self-funded plan and pays a portion of the family coverage. Health and dental insurance rates are projected to remain the same with changes to the plan.

The Town provides a 401(k) benefit of 5% for employees hired before July 1, 2012. The proposed budget includes this benefit with no changes.

Capital Outlay

The following amounts are included in the departmental recommendations:

- Road Maintenance: \$109,000 Backhoe and \$25,000 for a pickup truck
- Police: \$40,000 for new patrol vehicle. As well as \$15,000 grant money for body cameras and weapons upgrades. Also \$5,500 for a new defibrillator.
- Vehicle Maintenance: \$5,500 for new tire changer.
- Recreation Department: \$15,000 for the reconstruction of steps to the fire pit and/or determine best solution for stabilizing the erosion on the bank.
- Water/Sewer Utility: \$370,000 for various projects yet to be determined.
- E911 Backup Center, total cost \$470,000 of which \$380,000 will be Grant Funding. \$90,000 will come from E911 fund reserves.

Total Capital Outlay in General Fund Recommended: \$209,500. Total Capital Outlay in the Utility Fund is \$370,000

Continuation of the new Water Treatment Plant

Possible other Utility projects.

TOWN OF BEECH MOUNTAIN, NORTH CAROLINA 2015-2016 BUDGET ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF BEECH MOUNTAIN TOWN COUNCIL:

SECTION 1. GENERAL FUND.

A. *REVENUES*. It is estimated that the revenues as listed below will be available during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016, to meet the appropriations as set forth in Subsection C below. All fees, commissions and sums paid to or collected by any Town official, officer or agent for any service performed by such official, officer or agent in his official capacity shall insure to the benefit of the Town and become Town funds.

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- B. AD VALOREM TAX LEVY. There is hereby levied for the fiscal year 2015-2016 an ad valorem property tax on all property in the Town of Beech Mountain as of January 1, 2015, at a rate of .732¢ on each hundred dollars (\$100.00) assessed value pursuant to and in accordance with the Machinery Act of Chapter 105 of the North Carolina General Statutes and other applicable laws. Property shall be assessed at one hundred percent (100%) of its true value. The estimated revenues from the ad valorem property tax set out in Section 1-A of this Ordinance are based on an estimated collection during the 2014-2015 fiscal year of ninety-seven percent (97%) of the levy.
- C. APPROPRIATONS. The following amounts are hereby appropriated to the Town Manager for the operation of the Town of Beech Mountain and its departments and agencies for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016. In administering the programs authorized under this Ordinance, the Town Manager is authorized to make transfers from one appropriation to another within the same fund. Any such transfer shall be reported to the Town Council at its next regular meeting and shall be recorded in the minutes of that meeting. The Town Manager is authorized to make expenditures of \$10,000 or less from contingency appropriations by transfer to departments and agencies. Any such expenditure shall be reported to the Town Council at its next regular meeting and recorded in the minutes of that meeting. The Town Manager may establish personnel positions which may become necessary within the funds provided in this Ordinance or amendments thereto.
